City of Cathedral City

Council Members hold 4-year terms

- Districts 3, 4 & 5 terms begin following election in November 2022
- Districts 1 & 2 terms begin following election in November 2024





Redistricting Process

| Step | Description |
|------------------------------------|---|
| Initial Pre-Draft Hearings (2) | Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input from the community Identify "neighborhoods," "communities of interest," and "secondary areas." |
| Initial deadline for draft maps | Deadline for the public to submit draft maps for inclusion in the next hearing packet and presentation |
| Release draft maps | Draft maps posted to project website |
| Public Hearings (post-map) (2) | Public Hearings to discuss and revise or adopt the draft map(s) |
| Map adoption | Map adopted via ordinance or resolution. Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption. May happen at Hearing 4. |



Findings

Total Deviation is just above the "acceptable" range at 10.24%

 Two of the five districts are already majority/minority population.
 Districts 1, & 4 are majority/minority Hispanic

Current district boundaries *must* be adjusted for population balance





Preeminent Considerations

- Equal population (one person/one vote)
- Racial minority voice
- Geographically contiguous districts
- Measured objectively





Important Considerations "Communities of Interest"

Physical boundaries

- Natural or artificial barriers
- Roadways, rivers, railways
- Parks, schools, and other landmarks
- Geographic integrity, compactness





Important Considerations "Communities of Interest"

- Political boundaries
 - School attendance areas
 - Special district service areas
 - Federal, state, and county divisions





Important Considerations "Communities of Interest"

- ≻ Not:
 - Incumbents' residences
 Political affiliations







Findings – Map Option A


Total Deviation is below the "acceptable" range at 4.12%

- Preserves Districts 1, & 4 as majority/minority Hispanic voting districts
- ➢ Retains the core of existing districts
- Districts 1 and 2 very similar to existing boundaries

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
Findings – Map Option B

- ➤Total Deviation is below the "acceptable" range at 3.53%
- Creates new majority/minority Hispanic voting districts in Districts 2, 3 and 5
- Significant change in the configuration of the districts
- Creates compact districts


Findings – Map Option C

- Total Deviation is below the "acceptable" range at 4.05%
- Creates new majority/minority Hispanic voting districts in Districts 2 and 4
- Change in the configuration of the districts but does respect the core of existing districts
- Respects communities of interest both north and south of Date Palm Drive

Findings – Map Option D

- Total Deviation is below the "acceptable" range at 8.56%
- Closely resembles the existing map
- Preserves majority/minority voting districts in Districts 1 & 4
- Protects communities of interest
 - The neighborhoods in the area between Avenida Maravilla and Date Palm Drive were left in District 5 and the area between Date Palm Drive and Santoro Drive remains in District 3.

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Timeline & Next Steps

- Continue to take public input.
- One additional public hearing must be held before the Council may vote on a proposed final boundary map.
- The approved map must be submitted to the County Registrar of Voters no later than April 17, 2022.

| December 8, 2021 | 1 st public hearing Held prior to the release of draft maps |
|-------------------|--|
| Winter 2021/22 | BB&K to prepare draft maps using 2020 census data |
| January 19, 2022 | Publish draft map(s) |
| January 26, 2022 | 2 nd public hearing Consideration and input on proposed draft maps |
| February 10, 2022 | 3 rd public hearing - Workshop Consideration and input on proposed draft maps |
| February 23, 2022 | 4 th public hearing Council to introduce ordinance approving final maps. |
| April 17, 2022 | City deadline to adopt ordinance after 2 nd reading (effective immediately) and to submit map to Registrar . |
| November 2022 | 2022 election |
